

#### **6th Grade Inquiry**

Compelling Question	
Michigan Content Expectations:	6 – G4.1.2 Compare and contrast the gender roles assigned to men and women in different societies.
Staging the Compelling Question:	Use current data to share facts related to traditional gender roles for boys and girls in society. Have students move to the side of the room that matches the gender best identified with each statement.

Venn diagram comparing roles of men vs. women based on the sources provided and student's prior knowledge and experiences.

#### Supporting Question 2

Does (or should) society treat men and women equally?

#### Formative Performance Task

Write three statements a male, female or both would say about their role in society based on what we've learned. Share statements in a "Who am I" game format where students will move to the area of the room that they believe is the correct answer (male, female, both)..

#### Formative Performance Task

Respond to supporting question independently and then discuss whole group. Write a letter to a future child describing your hopes for their future (related to gender roles).

### Overview

Students will analyze information detailing gender roles in society and determine if it is better to be a boy or a girl.

## **Staging the Compelling Question**

Signs for "men" and "women" will be hung on opposite sides of the room. Students will be read a series of facts regarding equality of men and women throughout the world. Students will move to the side of the room that they feel the fact applies to.

## **Supporting Question 1 Overview**

What are the different roles of men and women in society?

Students will be provided with a variety of sources that identify details about the traditional gender roles of men and women in different regions around the world. Students will analyze the sources and use the information, along with their prior knowledge, to compare the roles of men and women in the form of a Venn diagram.

## **Supporting Question 2 Overview**

Does (or should) society treat men and women equally?

Students will read two articles which highlight the inequalities between men and women in society. Student will use their T4 strategies (annotating) for the first article. Source B will be used for a jigsaw activity where each group is provided with a portion of the article to analyze and discuss. Then, students will write three statements as a male, female or both would say about their role in society based on what we've learned. Using those statements, students will share them and participate in a "Who am I" game format where students will move to the area of the room that they believe is the correct answer (male, female, both). Lastly, students will debate the supporting question in small groups and/or as a whole class.

## **Supporting Question 3 Overview**

Why are men and women treated differently in some societies?

Students will watch two videos and analyze an infographic that discuss or illustrate why males and females are treated differently in society. After viewing the sources students will respond to the question independently in a few sentences and then discuss their responses as a whole group. Next, students will write a letter to a future child (similar to the video) describing their hopes for the child's future related to gender roles.

## Summative Performance Task Overview

Students will be asked to take a position on the question, "Is it better to be a girl or boy in society?" They will work with a partner or small group to create a podcast which identifies 3-5 reasons to support their position. Each reason should be supported by evidence from the resources provided. Students will record themselves for the podcast in an interview format and also provide a written transcript of the podcast.






